Medicaid is a crucial healthcare program in Pennsylvania, providing coverage to over **3 million residents**, including **children**, **seniors**, **people with disabilities**, **and low-income families**. The program ensures access to essential healthcare services, including preventive care, hospital stays, mental health services, and long-term care.

Who Benefits?

- **Children**: 42% of Medicaid enrollees in Pennsylvania are children, ensuring they receive necessary medical care, immunizations, and early intervention services.
- **Seniors & People with Disabilities**: 33% of enrollees are either elderly or disabled, relying on Medicaid for long-term care, home-based services, and nursing home coverage.
- **Rural Communities**: Medicaid covers a larger share of rural Pennsylvanians than urban residents, ensuring access to healthcare where private insurance may be scarce.
- **Veterans & Military Families**: 1 in 10 veterans rely on Medicaid for healthcare coverage, filling gaps left by the VA system.



Economic Impact

Medicaid is an **economic driver** for Pennsylvania. It supports **local hospitals**, **health centers**, **and community clinics**, preventing closures—especially in rural areas. Medicaid expansion has:

- Created 15,500 new jobs
- Generated \$2.2 billion in economic output
- Reduced uncompensated hospital care costs by 32%
